LIVING IN EXILE

1 Peter 3:8-12— Good for Evil April 24, 2016

Do not repay evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary, bless, for to this you were called... -1 Peter 3:9

I. A LIST OF CHRISTIAN VIRTUES

- 1. Unity of mind (Eph. 4:3).
- 2. Sympathetic (Matt. 9:36).
- 3. Brotherly love (John 13:34; 1 Thess. 4:9).
- 4. Tender-hearted (Luke 7:11-15).
- 5. Humble-minded (James 4:6).
- 6. Not seeking revenge (Rom. 12:18-20; Heb. 10:30).
- 7. Blessing others (Rom. 15:29).

II. LOVE LIFE AND WANT GOOD DAYS? TRY THIS...

- 1. Keep your tongue from evil (James 3:1-12).
- 2. Don't lie or lead others astray (Acts 5:3; Heb. 6:18; Rev. 21:8).
- 3. Turn from evil and do good (John 5:14; Matt. 5:16).
- 4. Seek peace; pursue it until you find it (Ps. 34:14; Matt. 5:9).

III. GOD IS FOR THE RIGHTEOUS

- God has a unique and covenantal love for his children. We are special (Gen. 6:8; 2 Chron. 16:9; Ps. 1).
- God does not respond to everyone's prayers (vs. 12; Isa. 1:10-20; 1 Pet. 3:7).
- God is against those who are evil. His "face" is against them. Who does evil? Those who reject the Lord (Num. 6:22-27; 1 Pet. 2:8).

KNOW: Our text for today is basic Christianity. When we obey, we are blessed, but when we do not, we do not receive a blessing, and if we refuse to obey the gospel, we can expect God to turn from us.

DO: Practice a biblical faith.

Questions/Discovery Points for Life Groups/Families

- 1. Peter is fond of giving us lists of dos and don'ts. People say that Christianity isn't about dos and don'ts. So, is it, or isn't it?
- 2. Of the list of Christian virtues, which ones are easy to do? How do we make them a part of our life?
- 3. Peter tells us in verse 9 that if we bless others we will obtain a blessing. Do we give to get in Christianity? Are we hedonists at heart?
- 4. We discussed whether God hears or responds to the prayers of the lost? What are your thoughts on that discussion? When does God hear the prayer of the "lost"?
- 5. Read Hebrews 10:30-31 and discuss in relation to 1 Peter 3:12.
- 6. How does a Christian who wants to obey our passage for Sunday actually do so? What are some steps in the right direction?
