

## *That You May Know*

Abiding in Christ — 1 John 2:28-29  
March 17, 2019

And now, little children, abide in him, so that when he appears we may have confidence and not shrink from him in shame at his coming. **-1 John 2:28**

### I. REASONS TO ABIDE

- John gives us multiple reasons to abide in God/Christ/the word/the Spirit in his letter:
  1. So that we may not stumble (2:10)
  2. To be strong and to overcome the evil one (2:14)
  3. To be in unity with the Father and the Son (2:24)
  4. In order to discern truth from error (2:27)
  5. In order to have confidence at Christ's return (2:28)
  6. That we may not sin (3:6; 3:9)
  7. That we might care for others' needs (3:17)
  8. To demonstrate that the Spirit lives in us (3:24; 4:13)
  9. That God's love may be perfected in us (4:12)
- Jesus will appear again—this is one of the great hopes of our faith (Matt. 24:27, 30, 39-44; 1 Cor. 15:23; 1 Thess. 5:23; Col. 3:4; 2 Tim. 4:8; James 5:7-8).
- There are two possibilities for us when Christ appears:
  1. We will be confident (2 Tim. 4:8).
  2. We will shrink back in shame (Matt. 25:1-13; Mark 13:32-37).

### II. BORN OF GOD

- A person's knowledge of God helps them discern who is truly one of his followers (vs. 29; John 13:35; 15:8; Acts 4:13).
- The formula is relatively simple: If you know that God is righteous, those who practice righteousness are God's children (John 1:9-13; 6:28-29).

**KNOW:** Confidence at the return of Christ demands abiding in Christ. God is righteous, so are those who are called by his name.

**DO:** Abide in Christ and be confident when he returns.
